Heavenly Culture, World Peace, Restoration of Light's World Alliance of Religions' Peace (WARP) Office is a forum for dialogue centering on world peace in interfaith relations and scriptural texts. It aims to prevent the conflicts caused by religious misunderstandings and bring forth peace through gaining deeper understandings of the standards and teachings of each religion and the concept of peace spoken about in each Scripture. The WARP Offices that engage local and regional communities of all religions are arising all over the world. There are 104 offices in 56 countries (as of November 25th, 2015), covering all continents, Europe, Oceania, The Americas, Asia, the Middle East, Africa, and CIS and the numbers are increasing. Among various nations, global conflict zones such as the Middle East, the Philippines, Indonesia, and Nigeria have also opened HWPL WARP Offices and are taking proactive steps toward peace.

This innovative task has stirred discussions among leaders of various faiths and has increased interaction between them. It has shown itself to be an effective tool to break down walls between religions and achieve our common goal: peace. These peace office meetings are becoming a way to create bridges between religions in all areas of the globe. With each successive peace meeting that have become a global movement, an increasing number of influential religious leaders go beyond their roles and sincerely work, with a sense of duty, as the messengers of peace.

Dear Religious Representatives and Leaders around the world



God, the Creator of Heaven and Earth, is the father of all creation. All created things are children of the Creator. People of religion who believe in the God of heaven are the family of heaven.

This family of God dividing itself, causing conflicts and wars, and killing one another is neither the will nor teaching of God who is love, peace, and life. All religions must become one under the true God.

For this purpose, we invited religious leaders around the world to the Republic of Korea and hosted the World Alliance of Religions' Peace (WARP) Summit on 18 September 2014. Since then, HWPL WARP Offices have been established around the world, where religious leaders are actively meeting to compare religious texts. Currently, former and current politicians and legal professionals are working together to finalize the international convention on the cessation of war, and this convention will soon be made known to the international community.

People of religion should also make efforts to keep the promise by quickly establishing the HWPL WARP Office in their respective regions and by gathering here to compare and study religious texts to unify them under the one that provides the most trustworthy testimony. Through this work, we can bring about the true unity of religion. If the

promise is not carried out, heads of various organizations including youth and women's groups and journalists will urge that the promise be fulfilled.

The work of studying and comparing religious texts should transcend all borders of nation, race, religion, and ideology. We should work toward a common purpose without partiality or prejudice. When it comes to comparing religious texts, we should approach with a sense of absolute righteousness and justice. And we should examine the scriptures before God.

Dear religious leaders, let us become God's lips, hands, and feet and bring about peace and the cessation of war, which is what God and humanity have been waiting for. Let us establish peace as an inheritance for our future generations and make this world a place where God reigns. This is the mission entrusted to us people of religion.




Kosovo

Los Angeles, "Advancing the Light of Peace: HWPL Peace Event"

LOS ANGELES—A flurry of anticipation filled the room of over 350 student and community leaders who convened at the Cerritos Center for Performing Arts on the 7th of November for the “Advancing the Light of Peace: HWPL Peace Event,” a forum to discuss peace initiatives in the sectors of religion, education, city government and women in the Southern California region. The forum, hosted by Heavenly Culture, World Peace, Restoration of Light (HWPL), included an honored welcome for the Chairman of HWPL, Mr. Man Hee Lee and Chairwoman of IWPG, Ms. Kim Nam Hee. Chairman Lee’s visit to the United States marked his 21st World Peace Tour.

As a representative of the religious sector, Sikh Ambassador Mr. Bhai Sahib Satpal Singh Khalsa, spoke on his experiences with HWPL’s World Alliance of Religions’ Peace (WARP) Offices that facilitate the discussion of religious Scriptures for understanding. “I have been regularly attending the WARP meetings organized by HWPL and I must say it has been an enlightening and learning experience for





me. I am happy to be a part of the HWPL family and whole-heartedly support the peace mission of HWPL. I am truly inspired by Chairman Lee's peace mission and I have pledged to work along with Chairman Lee and Chairwoman Kim. I feel they are working diligently and with full dedication towards achieving peace in the world. I find a ray of hope in Chairman Lee as I feel God himself has sent him as a messenger of peace to us."

Mr. Waqas Syed, Deputy Secretary General of Islamic Circle of North America (ICNA) also spoke on his experiences. "Couple of months ago I had the privilege to attend the 1st Annual Commemoration of the 2014 Peace Summit in Seoul, Korea I have been participating in the LA WARP office for the past year and every time I see the enthusiasm for peace among the youth, I am motivated more and more to contribute to this cause." Also adding his thoughts about the WARP Offices, "I urge the HWPL Offices to continue to not only provide these forums but also to play a major role globally in establishing peace for everyone everywhere by sharing everyone's experiences."

Chairman Lee explained how the HWPL WARP Offices were established to fulfill the promises made at the 2014 World Alliance of Religions' Peace Summit - a pledge in the sight of God, the peoples of the world, with the heavens and earth called as witnesses, to enact an International Law and to unite all religions under the Creator. He emphasized the importance of the comparison of scriptures to find the scripture that provides the most trustworthy testimony.

Chairman Lee who is working as a peace advocate, transcending nationality, race and religion, emphasized how religions must become one in order to cease conflicts and wars and to fulfill peace on this earth. Urging everyone to become messengers of peace to leave peace as a legacy to the future generations. All who listened sent their applause and cheers at the end of his speech. The forum concluded with a united unanimous raising of hands, from volunteers to leaders to signify their commitment to peace.

A wind of peace was blowing in Myanmar on November 12 as the International Buddhist School of Sagaing held the World Alliance of Religions’ Peace (WARP) Office Dialogue of Scriptures meeting, a gathering for discussion based on various religious scriptures. Members of the International Peace Youth Group (IPYG) sang a song entitled “World of Peace” to congratulate and support the meeting of unity and peace among religious leaders. In attendance were nine religious leaders from four different religions, including Ven. Sobhita from Buddhism, Al-Haj U Nyunt Maung Shein from Islam, Mr. U Kan Kaung from Hinduism and Dr. Zaw Win Aung from Christianity as well as approximately 150 audience members.

Ven. Sobhita (Buddhism, Principal of International Buddhist Education Centre) said in his congratulatory speech, “Amid the active peace movement by HWPL in Myanmar, a day of democracy has started in Myanmar. True peace will come soon in Myanmar. I want to say thank you to the chairman of HWPL and chairwoman of IWPG.”



“Essential Core Value of Religion”: What is the Purpose of Scriptures?

Participants were asked whether they think the scriptures of other religions can be helpful to reach the goal of their own religion. The Rt Revd David Nyi Nyi Naing (Anglican Church, Bishop of Mandalay) answered, “All religions seek for truth. If we know the truth, that truth will help us be enlightened.”

Ven. Ashin Dr. Kumara (Buddhism, Rector of Sitagu International Buddhist Academy) responded to this with, “Even though the relation and explanation of Scriptures are not the same; their purpose is the same. All religions have the same goal of ‘absolute peace’.”


Afterwards while giving feedback about the meeting, Mr. U Kan Kaung (Hinduism, Member of the Upper Myanmar Hindu Committee) said, “I have been to a numerous number of religious conferences, but this kind of meeting has been the first so far. I was especially impressed by the discussion time. The advantage is that we can mutually understand each other through these kind of meetings.”

Imam U Soe Nay Oo (Islam, Imam of Myoma Mosque) said, “It was better than the first HWPL Peace Dialogue in Sagaing. I had a chance to deeply understand the scripture through the O/X quiz session, I liked it. I didn’t know the meaning of the lyrics of the peace song, but I could feel it in my heart. If I knew more information about the conference, I could have invited more people.”

The WARP Office Dialogue of Scriptures meetings in Myanmar are currently taking place in Sagaing and Yangon. Heavenly Culture, World Peace, Restoration of Light (HWPL) has stated their plans to continue hosting the WARP Offices in the two regions as well as establishing more offices to spread the message of peace throughout all of Myanmar. HWPL has grabbed the attention of the international community by defining a new culture of peace. This culture can be seen in the current work to implement the International Convention on the Renunciation and Cessation of War and International Armed Conflicts and the establishment of the HWPL World Alliance of Religions’ Peace Offices.





Suva, Fiji — November 14, 2015 (local time) at the Sri Sri Radha Golokabihari Temple, various religious leaders came together at the Dialogue of Scriptures meeting to discuss the topic, “The End Times according to the Scriptures”. The speakers of the 6th WARP Office meeting were Mr. Epeli Saukuru (Seventh Day Adventist Church, Minister of Fiji Mission of Seventh Day Adventist Church), Mr. Bhagirati Bhan (Hinduism, President of USP Hindu Society) and Mr. Bryan Lee; Senior Researcher of HWPL and Pastor of Seong Gwang Church. With the help from Mr. Epeli Vakatawa of Fiji One TV the meeting was able to be aired live online.



“The End Times According to the Scriptures”



Mr. Epeli Vakatawa, who was the MC of the meeting, had attended the 1st Annual Commemoration of September 18th World Alliance of Religions' Peace Summit in South Korea earlier this year, and was so deeply moved by the event that he produced a documentary on the Summit. The documentary was first aired in Fiji on November 1, 2015 and will be aired again soon.

The meeting commenced with a presentation of the results and importance of the 1st Annual Commemoration Ceremony of the WARP Summit, followed by a video regarding the end times and concluding with an O/X quiz session. This was all viewed live by audiences in both Fiji and South Korea. There was also a time to hear and check what the audiences thought in regard to the end times, providing an opportunity for religious leaders to reflect on the responses from the audience. The three speakers made presentations about what their respective scriptures mentioned about the end



times. The presentation section was followed by a heated but respectful debate.

Mr. Bhagirati Bhan mentioned the commonality of each scripture, “There are many common contents in different religious scriptures, not only in the Hindu and Christian scriptures but also in the Quran, the Scripture of Islam.” Mr. Epeli Saukuru said, “I believe that the objective of all religions is to work towards peace and to help each other to prepare for the end of the age.” He also expressed his gratitude for being able to attend the Dialogue of Scriptures meeting for international peace.

As a closing performance, the Korean youth sang a song of peace in Fijian to show their determination to continue their support for the work of peace in Fiji and in appreciation for the religious leaders. The Dialogue of Scriptures will continue at the 7th HWPL Fiji WARP Office on the 5th of December.

Germany, located in Central Europe, is a country which has overcome the painful memories and scars of war. Berlin, the capital of Germany, once symbolized ‘Division’ due to the Berlin Wall. Since the fall of the Berlin Wall in 1989, it has now come to symbolize ‘Freedom and Peace’. The HWPL WARP Office meeting was held in Berlin to bring unity through inter-religious communication and the Dialogue of Scriptures. In the midst of terrorism and religious conflicts, the WARP offices are providing a space for religious leaders to come together to spread the message of peace in Germany, Europe and beyond.

The meeting held in Rathaus Charlottenburg(the City Hall), on the 31st of October, was attended by religious leaders representing the faiths of Islam, Hinduism and Christianity as well as five members from the Religion Abraham and the Pakistan Ambassador in Germany. Ambassador Mr. Ameer Rathore, who delivered the congratulatory message address, had great interest in HWPL’s peace activities. His interest was focused especially on the WARP Offices, expressing his prayers for world peace and his sadness for the unfortunate incidents caused by religious extremists.



“Does God Exist as a Spirit?”

The participants had an in-depth discussion on the topic, “Does God Exist as a Spirit?” with presentations based on their respective scriptures. Prior to the speech presentations, the religious leaders watched a short video of interviews of people on the streets of Berlin. The question asked was the same one given to the Dialogue of Scriptures participants. Witnessing the fact that there were many people who had a difficult time believing in the existence of God reinforced the mission of religious leaders to inform the people of God’s mind and guide them to the path of truth.

In response to the topic question, Mr. Ali Alinc (Religion Abraham, a representative of Religion Abraham) said, “God is a spiritual being, one you can feel, but not see.” Sheikh Jamaluddin E. Dirschl (Islam, Sheikh of the Naqshibandi Order Germany) answered “Allah is an entity that is not visible and is powerful.” Also, Shri Sarvabhavana (Hinduism,

Shri of the Vedic Community in Berlin) stated that “God is a being that exceeds time and space. God is an eternal being, and he knows everything.” Mr. Feizhou Zhu, (Protestant, Pastor of the Mission Church in China) said, “God cannot be seen, but he has created everything and through the Word of God, we can see his existence.”

The meeting provided a time for the religious leaders to compare and understand the Scriptures of other religions. Also, they were made aware of the aim and purpose of the HWPL WARP Offices. Sheikh Jamaluddin E. Dirschl shared his impressions of the meeting, “I would like to always work with HWPL and I will participate in the next WARP Office meeting.” The Berlin WARP Office will be a seed of peace that is expected to blossom and achieve its main goal to establish a deeper understanding among religions.





In spite of the tension in the Middle East since the terrorism in France, the 6th HWPL Bahrain Manama WARP Office was held on the 14th of November. At this meeting, women and youth members who love peace also attended showing their desire for peace within the Middle East. Religious leaders from Islam, Sikhism, Hinduism, and Christianity participated in the Dialogue of Scriptures.

The participation of women and youth at the WARP Office meetings was first suggested by HWPL Publicity Ambassador Mr. Mohamed Buzaboon (Islam, Chairman of the Bahrain Association for Religious Coexistence & Tolerance) He agreed with HWPL chairman Mr. Man Hee Lee's proposal about the importance of women and youth in achieving world peace. Mr. Buzaboon has the role of monitoring and encouraging the religious leaders in their efforts towards fulfilling peace.

Representative of Sikhism, Mr. Teja Singh (Sikhism, Volunteer of the Sikh temple) commented, "This is something very unique, to discuss on the same topic with people of different faiths. From different religions everybody participated to know about religions different from their own. To speak about death and life is very informative for human beings. I really enjoyed it."



Life of Unresolved Worries — Opinion on “The Secret of Human Life (birth, old age, sickness, and death)”

Mr. Ebrahim Nono (Judaism, member of the Jewish community) answered, “Life and death is the essence of human life. Throughout the Torah ‘old’ is linked to wisdom and the Holy Scripture considers old age a virtue and a blessing. The fact that God has granted a person a single additional day of bodily life means that he has not yet concluded his mission in life, and that there is still something for him to achieve in this world.”

Following Imam Ahmed Khan (Islam, Imam of Discovery Islam) said, “When we get sick, we are taught by the Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) that it is a forgiveness of our sins. ‘Seeing that you were dead and He gave you life. Then He will give you death, then again will bring you to life (on the Day of Resurrection) and then unto Him you will return’ (Quran, Sura Al-Baqarah: 28).”

To the question, “Is the reason for birth, old age, sickness, and death recorded in your Scripture?” Mr. Vijay Kumar (Hinduism, Priest of Manama Hindu Temple) answered, “In the scriptures of Hinduism, suffering or pain means physical, mental and emotional instability and afflictions. This manifests in ageing, sickness, death and rebirth.”

Mr. Peter Bae (Christianity, Doctor of Association of Studying Bible) answered, “Birth, old age, sickness and death came upon humans because of Adam’s sin by breaking the covenant with God. God who is the source of life left men and therefore death came in. Not only the reason but also the way to resolve sin is written in the Bible. As it is sin that brought death, sin has to be resolved. How to resolve sin is also well recorded in the Bible. What is hopeful is that in Revelation, the last book of the Christian scripture; it is prophesied or promised that the world of death would be restored to the world of life.”

In order to facilitate peace among religions, women and youth are encouraged to participate in all WARP Office meetings. The women and youth groups have been tasked with the responsibility to support and encourage religious leaders to participate in the WARP Office Dialogue of Scriptures meetings. In addition, for peace to finally become a reality they are asked to urge the current and former heads of state and chief justices to enact the International Convention on the Renunciation and Cessation of War and International Armed Conflicts.

Q. What expectations do you hold when attending the WARP Office meetings?

A. Through the WARP Office meetings, I expect all to be united under the work of peace and serving the prosperity of humanity, putting all stereotypes and prejudices aside and understanding different religious beliefs.

Q. As you have attended multiple WARP meetings, what continues to hold your interest?

A. Through the meetings, I have gained a better understanding of not only the teachings of my own religion but also those of other religions. I want to help others understand what I have recognized.

Q. What did you like most about the WARP Office meetings? Do you have any suggestions on how the WARP Office meetings can be improved?

A. The World Alliance of Religions' Peace Office meeting provides a platform where I can share my religious beliefs and doctrines to the audience and form a network to establish peace with religious leaders of different backgrounds. It serves as a bridge to connect people of various faiths. I hope to have sufficient time with each religious leader to suggest discussion topics and share opinions ahead of each meeting.

Q. As you listened to the contents of other scriptures during the Dialogue of Scriptures, did you have any realizations? What contents should be included in any religious scripture?

A. I have come to understand that there is one Creator described slightly differently in each scripture. Therefore, I believe that all religious texts should record the forms and images of God, His Holy Name, and a detailed process of how to love Him. True religion enables us to be close to God, to love, and respect Him by becoming His true servant.

Q. Is there anything you'd like to share with religious leaders who haven't joined the WARP Office meetings yet?

A. I'd like to emphasize the importance of respecting and understanding the beliefs of other religions, thereby gaining deeper understandings of our own religion. Only when we seek the will of the Creator, through putting efforts in participating in these meetings, can we say we love the Creator. HWPL is doing the amazing work of bringing peace on earth by helping all to love the Creator. I'd like to thank HWPL for hosting the WARP Office meeting.
