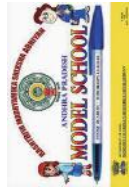

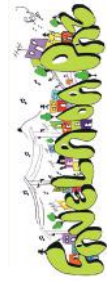

Greetings, I am Man Hee Lee, the peace advocate of Heavenly Culture, World Peace, Restoration of Light (HWPL).

I have received the answer and the instructions to achieve peace from heaven, and have gone around the world twenty times to share this answer that can bring about the cessation of war and achievement of peace on earth. Transcending all borders of nation, race, religion, and ideology, I have shared this answer with former and current heads of state, chief justices, political leaders, heads of various organizations, and religious representatives and leaders from different countries.

All creation and people of the world are able to sustain their lives with the light, rain, and air the heavens provide. Despite this huge grace, people cause wars and commit horrid murders for the sake of their greed and national benefit. That is why I stood in front of the Peace Gate of Seoul Olympic Park on the Independence Day of Korea in 2010 and sent a message to the entire world - the Declaration of Unification - and on May 25, 2013, I proclaimed to the world the Declaration of World Peace.

Dear family members around the world, are we going to leave conflicts and wars as an inheritance to our descendants? Or are we going to leave peace as a legacy by establishing a world of peace in this generation?

A religion ought to give the teachings of righteousness: to love one's neighbor as oneself and to create a world of peace (shalom). All politicians who love their nations and people ought to keep their promises and establish policies of peace. These will become meaningful policies that consider the well-being of the nation and the people. The first International Law Peace Committee was launched at the 1st Annual Commemoration of the World Al-

liance of Religions' Peace Summit, and it is actively working towards the implementation of an International Convention on the Cessation of War and Achievement of World Peace, as well as a peace declaration for the convention. This work of peace is not limited to one individual. I sincerely ask you again for your cooperation.

When wars break out, the youth are the first to be sacrificed on the frontlines. However, neither policies nor laws of this world have been able to offer compensation to the youth who have lost their lives in wars. For this reason, no matter what anyone else says or does, we must gather our strength to establish policies that will create peace, not wars.

We are one. Let us save humanity through peace. I sincerely ask this of you again, brothers and sisters around the world. Thank you.

Fiji Women and Youth to Restore Peace

Over 100 leaders of women and youth organizations from various countries gathered at the 1st Annual Commemoration of the WARP Summit in September to reaffirm their responsibility in urging the implementation of the Convention on the Cessation of War and Achievement of World Peace. They pledged to continue to demand the implementation in their home countries.

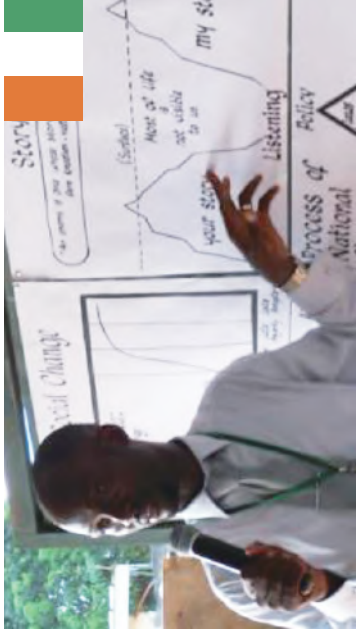
To put this pledge into practice, the members of the International Women's Peace Group (IWPG) and the International Peace Youth Group (IPYG) collaborated to host the 'IWPG and IPYG Day: Wings of Peace' conference on October 24th 2015 at the University of South Pacific (USP) in Suva, Fiji.

The session educated the audience about the essential role of youth and women in establishing peace, and spurred participants on to work toward more productive outcomes. Motivated by this event, a total of 42 people signed the Statement to Urge for the Implementation of the International Convention, while 30 new members signed up to join the IPYG, and 11 new members to join the IWPG.

The collective efforts of the IWPG and IPYG in Fiji strengthened the resolve made at the Summit, reminding all member organizations in other states not to forget the momentous event, and to continue to appeal to the international community.

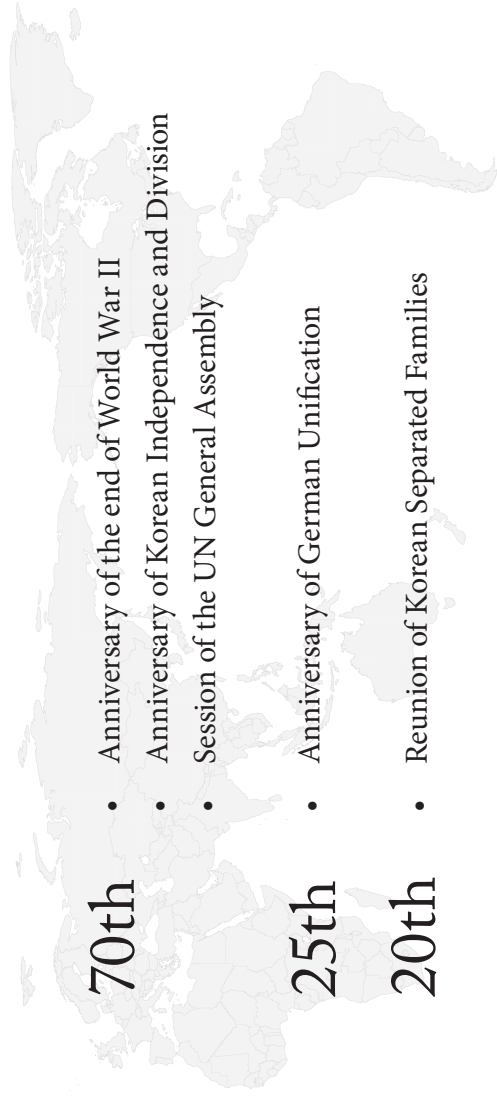

Two Koreas, One Family

The year of 2015 marks the...



In August 1945, both North and South Korea welcomed the long-awaited independence from Japan's 35-year occupation. However, the chance to enjoy this freedom was short-lived. The Korean Peninsula was about to face more bitter days with the outbreak of the Korean War.

The once one-hearted nation was divided by different ideologies and forced to point guns at each other. Today, 70 years on, we are still living with the legacy of war as the recent 20th reunion of Korean separated families reminds us of the harsh reality of the division of the two Koreas.

As a Korean War Veteran, HWPL Chairman Mr. Man Hee Lee has not forgotten the suffering he and his fellow soldiers endured in their youth during the war. He recalls the atrocities committed against the youth as seen in the midst of war. After his experiences, he vowed to bring an end to military conscription and pointless conflict.

Since then, Chairman Lee has tirelessly pursued the work of peace that transcends borders, ethnicities, and religions by proclaiming the Declaration of Unification and the Declaration of World Peace for the first time in history. The two declarations serve as the standards for the critical task of the Implementation of the International Convention on the Renunciation and Cessation of War and International

Armed Conflicts, which Chairman Lee and the HWPL International Law Peace Committee are currently undertaking. Through various peace projects, he empowers the new generation of leaders to be active proponents of world peace and the unification of the Korean Peninsula.

Interview with Reporter Epeli Vakatawa of Fiji One TV

“All of a sudden, it came to me that it is a very selfish thing if I don’t share the peace that I experienced. Currently, as a reporter, the best thing I can do to share peace with the world and also with Fiji is to report the work of HWPL.”



Q. How does it feel to participate in the 1st Annual Commemoration of the World Alliance of Religions’ Peace Summit?

A. I have never been to any occasion as touching and moving as this. It was organized in the best possible way and the volunteers are just so amazing. It gives me a sense of ownership to be part of the whole occasion.

Q. What made you work as a Peace Ambassador?

A. In order to have, experience, enjoy, and live in peace, I have to share it with the world. Otherwise it would be very selfish of me. Therefore, joining HWPL was the only way for me to share peace with the rest of the world - including my country, Fiji.

Q. What is your purpose of making a documentary on HWPL?

A. A documentary is more detailed and more suitable for the message because I want to create awareness amongst the audience. This is another way of spreading the good news of peace, especially when the news organizations are avoiding the issue.

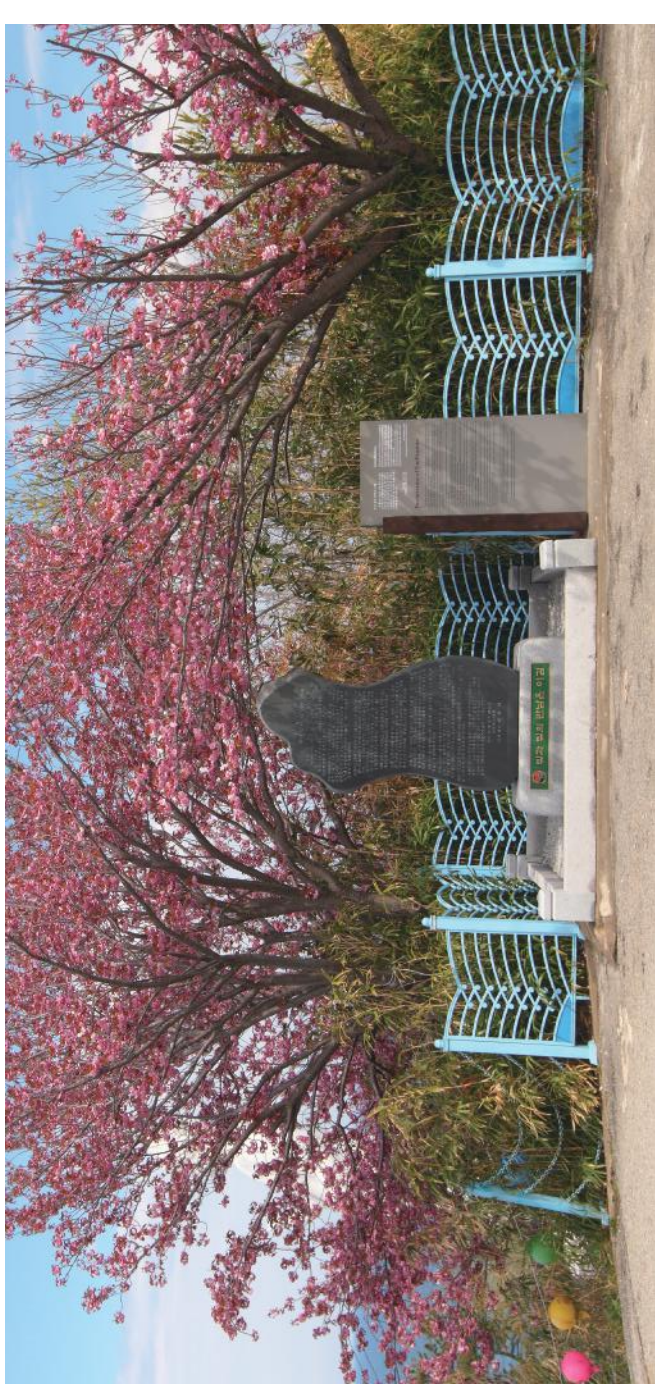
Q. What do you think of the role of press and media in achieving peace?

A. There is a saying, “information is power”. Press and media are capable of giving prominence to something and can also cause its destruction. They have an important role, a powerful role. With the Convention on the Cessation of War and World peace in the pipeline, we are the ones who can push the agenda of HWPL to the global community and at the same time hold leaders accountable if they don’t act on their promise of cooperating for the Convention.

HWPL — to the Realization of World Peace through the Unification of the Korean Peninsula

The Declaration of Unification

This nation must be unified as it was before as an independent nation. Our forefathers, who died for this country, and the Korean citizens of today never wished for this nation to be divided. The Korean Peninsula was divided because of the North’s invasion of the South, which led to a fratricidal and bloody war. Even today, we are still pointing guns at people of our own race. If our leaders truly love this nation and its citizens, they will work to establish a unified nation the citizens wish for and a country where people live happily in abundance.



The Declaration of World Peace

With the grace and life we have received, are we entitled to fight, kill and destroy one another? We cannot claim to desire peace and continue to provoke one another, causing conflict for the sake of valuing our own national interests above those of others. This is not a legacy we can leave to future generations ... Of what use is a young life, born in our day and age, if it is thrown away without having had a chance to bloom? What price can compensate for the loss of a life? ... We call on the heads of state of every country to sign an international agreement - a commitment to bringing all wars to an end. ... The only way to stop the fighting and pointless, tragic deaths, is to stop fighting.



HWPL's Worldwide Interfaith Peace Dialogue Series

The World Alliance of Religions' Peace (WARP) Office Meetings is HWPL's worldwide peace dialogue series in interfaith relations and scriptural texts. It aims to prevent the conflicts caused by religious misunderstandings and bring forth peace through gaining a deeper understanding of the standards and teachings of each religion and the concept of peace spoken about in each scripture. Through 102 offices in 55 countries, the Peace Office Meetings have become a global movement, and increasing number of influential religious leaders go beyond their roles and work as the messengers of peace with sincere duty.
